SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT:

Mr. Gupta reported:

- <u>Stevenson Variety Show</u> Best wishes to the brave and talented 2nd graders performing tonight. Acts include singing, dancing, comedy, and more. Special thanks to Mr. Silvestri for organizing this event.
- <u>Autism Awareness</u> On April 2nd, Fairfield Public Schools participated in Autism Awareness Day by wearing blue. Churchill staff and students showed support by purchasing Autism Awareness shirts from local business Steady Eddie Designs, and a special thanks to Mr. Santana for organizing that. The superintendent expressed pride in leading a district that provides strong programs for Autistic students, something not all districts offer. Special thanks were given to Director of Special Services, Meghan Cafone and her team for their outstanding work, and to the dedicated teachers and aides in MD classrooms who show deep care for their students.

HSA: Melinda Street reported:

• The HSA is hosting a Casino Night with a Havana Nights theme on Thursday, May 15th at Seasons. Tickets are available and all proceeds will go directly to support the schools and benefit the students. Please join them for a fun night!

Finance: Anthony DePascale reported:

• The budget will be discussed at the next meeting, including a review of the budget presentation. Things are currently looking positive and moving in the right direction. Attending the meeting is encouraged, as it will feature a more detailed presentation prepared by the new business administrator.

Buildings and Grounds: Anthony DePascale reported:

- Stevenson Roof Update: Over the past few months, Wally, Joe, and I have worked with the original roofing company due to ongoing leaks. Despite multiple repair attempts, the roof continues to leak. After a site visit with the company's regional manager and technicians, Wally determined that over 20% of the original roofing work has already been replaced. The vendor is proposing more patchwork repairs, but we believe this approach is unfair to both the district and the students. Our board attorney is now involved, and we will continue to provide updates as the situation develops.
- Recreation Grant Award: Thanks to Wally's initiative, we secured a \$87,000 recreation grant to improve Stevenson's outdoor spaces. The Grant will enhance playgrounds and fields for our students.

New/Old Business: Anthony DePascale reported:

The board has been actively seeking new revenue sources for the school and recently partnered
with the recreation department to create a rentable soccer field behind Stevenson School and also
rented out the baseball fields to two other organizations. If successful, the program may expand
to include fields at both Churchill and Stevenson schools. The board is proud of the progress and
hopeful about the potential for continued success.
